BORDER UNION AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY BYE-LAWS

1. All stock shown to take their ages from 1st January, if not otherwise stated.
2. Stock must be the bona fide property and in the possession of the Exhibitors from 29th June (the last day of entry).
3. Prize Lists and Entry Forms may be obtained from the Secretary's Office.
4. All entries must be made on the appropriate forms and submitted to the Secretary, Border Union Agricultural Society, Springwood Park, Kelso, not later than 5.00 p.m. on Monday 29th June. **Entries will not be accepted by telephone at any time.**
5. Exhibitors who have not paid their entry fees shall not be entitled to compete for prizes.
6. The age of animals must be given on the entry form unless stated otherwise in Conditions of Entry.
7. There can be no substitution of named entries in any section, and if there should be such a substitution, any resultant prize money may be withheld.
8. All Stock, Machinery and Equipment admitted to the Showground will remain entirely at the risk of their Exhibitors who must take charge of their property at all times.
9. Stock to be exhibited must be in the Showground at least one hour before judging is due to commence and on Saturday 25th July, no later than 9.00 a.m.
10. Stock Attendants must remain in charge of their exhibits until the end of the Show.
11. Admission tickets will be sent to Exhibitors prior to the Show. Attendants CANNOT obtain free admission to the Showground unless such a ticket is produced. The number of tickets allocated to exhibitors will be based, pro rata, on the total number of entries. The Directors reserve the right to place restrictions on the issue of admission tickets to Exhibitors (not being members) whose aggregate entry fee amounts to less than £5.
12. The Judges shall have the power to withhold any of the prizes should they think the exhibits are not deserving of them. The Judges are particularly requested to satisfy themselves, as far as possible, regarding the soundness of all Horses before awarding the prizes, and to avoid giving preference to animals showing symptoms of hereditary diseases. Judges may consult the Society's Veterinary Surgeons if they deem it expedient. **No protests on veterinary grounds will be received.**
13. During the judging of stock, no person will be allowed in the Ring except Judges, Stewards and Attending Members of the class being judged, and it is the duty of Attending Members to enforce this Bye-Law.
14. Judges who wish the assistance of another Judge shall have the power to choose one, and it is the duty of the Attending Member to see that the Judge so chosen has no personal interest in the stock to be judged. **Judges shall not place animals which they have bred or owned at any time.**
15. All disputes shall be referred to the Directors, by whom they shall be finally settled, without appeal, and all objections to the decision of the Judges, or otherwise, must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, within 24 hours from the date of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £30 which is liable to forfeit if the objection is not upheld.
16. All Cups and Trophies offered for competition at the Show are the property of the Border Union Agricultural Society and are awarded annually in perpetuity. They must be returned to the Secretary not less than fourteen days before the Show.
17. Prize Tickets will be attached to the prize-winning animals. All stock shall remain in their pens or stances until 3.30 p.m. and Industrial Exhibits until 5.00 p.m.
18. Prize-winning Horses, Ponies, Cattle and Goats exhibited on Saturday 25th July (**except Classes 142 to 147**) must take part in the Grand Parade.
19. **Judges have the authority to ask for the removal of any animal from the Showing.**
20. **Long Service Medallists** will be given free Admission. Tickets on application in writing to the Secretary.
21. The Directors of the Border Union Agricultural Society accept no responsibility whatever for loss, injury or damage to any person, animal or property on the Showground or the approaches thereto.

For Dales, Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest and Welsh this rule is extended to three years old or over.
- **All Native Breeds must be registered in their Breed Society Stud Books and the number given on the entry form.**
- No Spurs to be worn in Ridden Classes
- **The Directors reserve the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide classes according to the number of entries.**
- Judging times given for Pony Classes are approximate. Variations may occur according to the number of entries forward.
- **It is recommended that all Horses and Ponies should be fully vaccinated against Equine Influenza.**
